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1. Resume

The webinar was held on the 25th of November 2020 at Beirut Arab University and had 13 speakers from different countries. The webinar had 200 participants and the evaluation results were positive. Although the response rate was rather low, we can conclude that participants found the theme interesting and the format fulfilled their expectations.

2. Results

19 participants answered the evaluation form, where each question with a grade between 1-5, where 1 is Poor and 5 is Excellent. and the feedback was the following:

The general organization of the event and the agenda of the event were the two questions better rated. The speakers and methodologies used in the webinar were appreciated by the participants. They pointed out that the event contributed to their professional growth.

Although the general evaluation of the event was very good (all questions were ranked above 4 out of 5), participants reported a lower grade to the question on “The information and the material that was distributed before and during the event”. In future events we can consider sharing the agenda with information about the speakers and give the opportunity to participants to send questions in advance that would like to hear about in the webinar. Maybe, we can share the presentation after the event when we send the evaluation form link. Another issue was related to the feeling that the targets of the event have been fulfilled. The average of the evaluations of the different issues was 4,18/ 5, which seems to us to be a sign that the participants appreciated the interventions.
